Mr. GEORGES BOSSOUS, JR.



Mr. Bossous is a graduate from Barry University with a Master of Science in Psychology. He is currently pursuing a Doctorate degree in Public Health from Walden University.

He is the Founder and CEO of a philanthropic organization, Word and Action, Inc. The goal of this organization is to reduce the occurrences of childhood sexual abuse (CSA). He hopes to utilize his degree in public health to lead researches pertaining to CSA, as it relates to many sexually transmitted diseases including HIV/AIDS.

Bossous has been recently named as the Vice-Chair of the Health Task Force's Foreign Affaires Committee for District 38, Miami Dade, Florida.

Shortly after he obtained his Master of Science Degree in Psychology, Bossous held a position as a Mental Health Specialist and Psychotherapist at the Behavioral Department of the Community Health of South Dade, in Miami, Florida. In addition, he underwent a three-year-post-graduate training in the field of Infant Mental Health at the Institute For Child and Family Health, formerly known as Children Psychiatric Center. After his training, he was hired to provide mental health therapy for the aforementioned population, serving in this capacity for two years. For over ten years, he worked as a Psychotherapist and a Clinician.

Bossous has worked with the Florida Democratic Party and later on with MoveOn.org as a Field and Political Campaign Organizer. This experience allows him to have a closer encounter with real people and develop a better understanding of the issues related to Haitian-American community.

He is an active speaker and a child advocate for sexually abused children. In the State of Florida, he has held many seminars and conferences advocating on behalf of those victims. He has also participated in numerous engagements at Universities, Churches, Community Centers, Elementary and High schools addressing the aforementioned issue. He has been an active speaker on numerous radios and televisions' programs in the past and he currently has a personal segment at local community radios in the United States.

Bossous has held numbers of international trainings and conference in Haiti and the Dominican Republic. He has travelled to Bolivia where he covered and published a story regarding children who were living in prison with their parents.

Furthermore, for four years, he worked at the United Nations as a distribution manager for an Environmental Newspaper titled "The Earth Times." While working there, he was recognized as one of the contributors of a book, "All of US" published by the owner of The Earth Times, Prenay Gupte.
